

# MIRA EDGERLY WEDS.

She Becomes the Bride of Frederick  
Burt at Quiet Wedding.

The marriage of Frederick Burt of New York and Miss Mira Edgerly took place at 1 o'clock yesterday at the home of Herbert L. Griggs, 1 East Eighty-sixth Street, the ceremony being performed by the Rev. Dr. Thomas Slicer of All Souls' Church. Neither Mr. Burt nor his bride had any attendants. Miss Edgerly, who wore a blue Chinese robe, beautifully embroidered, was given in marriage by Mr. Griggs. Less than a dozen relatives were present, and there was no reception. Shortly after the ceremony Mr. and Mrs. Burt left for Washington. On their return here they will sail for France. Later they will go to Scotland, and will return to New York in the Autumn to live.

Mrs. Burt returned a short time since from Ottawa. While there she painted an ivory miniature of the Princess Patricia. She has spent some years abroad studying and painting. When in New York she lived at the National Arts Club in Gramercy Park. Mr. Burt is a writer, sculptor, and painter.
